

Resolution of [Local Entity]
Supporting the South Carolina American Revolution
Sestercentennial Commission
and
Creating a [Local Entity] “Committee of 99”

Whereas South Carolina created the South Carolina American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission (“250 Year Commission”);

Whereas the mission of the 250 Year Commission is to celebrate and promote South Carolina’s role in the American Revolution by educating, engaging, and inspiring South Carolinians and visitors;

Whereas the 250 Year Commission is seeking partnerships with counties and municipalities to further its mission;

Whereas this partnership will be formed by creating a local committee called “[Local Entity] Committee of 99.”¹

Whereas the [Local Entity] Committee of 99 will focus on important events, people, and places within [Local Entity] to celebrate and promote [Local Entity]’s role in the American Revolution by educating, engaging, and inspiring South Carolinians and visitors;

Whereas local projects (i.e. celebrations, restoration of local historical markers, rebuilding of local historical infrastructure, etc.) will enhance historical tourism opportunities;

Now, therefore be it

¹ The process of launching a new and independent government in the Province of South Carolina formally began on July 6, 1774 when leading men in South Carolina met in Charlestown to elect five delegates to the First Continental Congress in Philadelphia and create the Committee of 99, which soon became the "de facto" government of South Carolina.

RESOLVED, that [Local Entity]:

1. Will partner with the South Carolina American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission (“250 Year Commission”);
2. Will create a local committee called “[Local Entity] Committee of 99;”
3. Will support  initiatives by the 250 Year Commission; and
4. Will support the [Local Entity] Committee of 99 in their local efforts to educate, engage, and inspire South Carolinians and our visitors thereby enhancing historical tourism opportunities in [Local Entity].
